Letter From the Chair

The Pembina Foundation for Environmental Research and Education faced a challenging yet productive year in 2012. Thanks to our generous donors we were able to continue leveraging the expertise of service agencies — such as the Pembina Institute and GreenLearning Canada — to consistently deliver high-quality research, analysis and educational materials that gets results. Our work spanned a range of energy issues across the country, as well as exciting programs in youth environmental education.

In the Shadow of the Boom examined the effects, both positive and negative, of oilsands production and exports on Canada's economy. It also took a much-needed look at the longer-term economic implications of Canada's increased reliance on oilsands expansion to support economic growth and generate public revenue. This work was a top download, and was widely discussed across the country.

The Foundation also supported work in Ontario around transportation-related energy use. *Drivers' Choice: Options to manage gridlock and fund rapid transit in the GTA* and the *RBC-Pembina Home Location Study* surveyed Ontario residents about their commuting and homebuying patterns and preferences. Both found that drivers would prefer a shorter commute and better public transportation options, even paired with a smaller or more-expensive home. This finding has important implications for transportation policy in the province.

Representatives from a wide variety of sectors were surveyed and their thoughts on the province's carbon tax were presented in *British Columbia's Carbon Tax:* Exploring perspectives and seeking common ground. The publication also explored carbon tax design issues and communications challenges.

Staff from five municipalities in Washington and Oregon were interviewed for a report on *Electric Vehicle Charging Stations*. The piece outlined the municipalities' insights on successfully planning and installing EV charging stations — an important step in supporting the adoption of electric vehicles in Canada.

The Foundation's collaboration with GreenLearning Canada continued in 2012. In addition to an expanded selection of free education programs and lesson plans that address energy and environment-related topics in a wide range of subjects from grades four through 12, we also supported the Redfish School of Change field school for post-secondary students.

We are proud that we have been able to keep administrative costs low and optimize program development and delivery, as these results indicate.


